- handle senior level engagement with commercial counterparties, contractors, board members, steering committees, investors, banks/lenders as well as local and central government
- lead a proactive culture to ensure effective management of HSE throughout the project lifecycle
- be accountable for creating the optimal setup for the operations phase, including company structure, PPA/revenue management, delivery of JV services, O&M strategy, optimisation of the business case and ensuring compliance with commercial obligations and commitments.
- Furthermore, you'll be responsible for directing the engagement with Partnerships/M&A teams, delivering data room, contract novation etc. to ensure the delivery of M&A processes.

Your competencies include that you

- have a master's degree, with strong commercial and technical understanding
- have extensive experience and excellent leadership, negotiation and interpersonal skills to manage internal and external stakeholders
- have a good understanding of the financial and legal aspects of joint ventures and board governance and experience with complex transactions and ownership structures
- are a native speaker of Mandarin (reading traditional Chinese), with Taiwanese being a plus
- have strong communication and negotiation skills.

In addition, you speak and write English at an advanced level and thrive in an international environment.
